Time Limits What topic can you cover in the allotted time? How might you add or remove details to bring the same topic to life in different presentation lengths? Could you break a larger topic into several smaller topics?	
Audience Impact What one thing do you want the audience to remember? As a result of hearing this speech, how will your audiences' lives change for the better?
